

USF Terms to Know

- ACADEMIC STANDING: Students with a USF GPA above 2.0 are in "Good Standing," while
 those with a GPA below 2.0 are on "Academic Probation" and are at risk of dismissal if
 they do not maintain a semester GPA above 2.0. "Academic Deferment" refers to an
 additional probation semester given to first year students who would otherwise be
 dismissed.
- ARCHIVUM INSIGHTS: Online platform used to schedule and attend advising appointments, as well as to submit Academic Regulations Committee (ARC) petitions for Late Add, Late Withdrawal, Withdrawal Limit Exception, and Total Withdrawal from courses.
- BUILDING LEGENDS: Most buildings are referred to by a three-letter abbreviation. <u>View</u> a campus map with building legends here.
- <u>CANVAS</u>: An electronic course management system that allows students to access course material online. Both traditional and online classes utilize the Canvas system.
- CODE OF CONDUCT: Statements of expected conduct of all USF students, which is found here. Students who register at USF agree to abide by its regulations and policies.
 Violation of the Code of Conduct may subject students to disciplinary action.
- CO-REQUISITE: A course that must be taken in conjunction with another course.
- CURRICULUM: The prescribed classes in a program of study needed to complete a degree at a given institution.
- <u>DEGREEWORKS</u>: Detailed list of your degree requirements that have been met and/or remain unfulfilled.
- FULL-TIME: A student enrolled in 12 or more semester units.
- HOLDS: Placed on a student's record to prompt a specific action; can impact ability to register for or drop classes. <u>List of holds and their meaning can be found here</u>.
- MAJOR: The academic area in which students choose to study/pursue a degree.
- MIDTERM: An exam given in the middle of the semester to test students on material covered in the first part of the semester.
- MYUSF: Quick access to email, Archivum, DegreeWorks, Student Banner ("OASIS"), and other USF resources.
- PART-TIME: A student enrolled in fewer than 12 semester units.
- PERMIT TO REGISTER: The date and time when eligible students can begin registering for classes (found under OASIS at www.my.usf.edu).
- PRE-REQUISITE: A course which must be successfully completed before the student may enroll in a particular class.
- REGISTRATION: The act of enrolling in classes for a semester. Students register online using Web Registration.
- <u>STUDENT SELF SERVICE BANNER (FORMERLY "OASIS")</u>: Portal to your USF academic records (found at www.my.usf.edu)
- SYLLABUS: An outline of the important information about a course. Written by the professor or instructor, it usually includes instructor contact information, important dates, assignments, expectations and policies specific to that course.
